

## Full Day Downtown

### You'll need:

50-150 Dollars per person depending on food and activity choices.  
Swimming things - if not staying downtown

### Getting there.

If you're not staying downtown, take a taxi or drive your car to The Golden Nugget, and walk through the lobby doors straight ahead. This way you get to see the Golden Nugget's Shark Pool! Once you've seen it, turn right and walk through the casino out onto Fremont Street. Turn left, you're a few doors from The Golden Gate and Dupar's.

Where	Tips
<p><b>Breakfast at Dupar's Diner.</b> The best breakfast in Vegas. It is inside the Golden Gate Casino, which is on Fremont Street at the very top opposite the Plaza.</p>	<p><b>Try the Pancakes</b> at Dupar's- you don't need as many as you think! The Short Stack is huge. The entire menu is delicious, the corned beef hash to die for, and the coffee and fresh orange is a taste of California (hence 'Golden Gate').</p>
<p><b>Photo outside the Plaza.</b> You've seen this hotel in more movies than you remember. Robert Deniro has walked this driveway many times, and a great view back down Fremont (if the stage isn't blocking the view)</p>	<p><b>Oscar's</b> at The Plaza. Oscar is a Vegas legend. There are pictures of Oscar in his restaurant on the first floor of the Plaza, with many a famous person. If you're not hungry or thirsty yet, come back later perhaps. A better view of Downtown Vegas is hard to find from the semi-circular windows at the head of Fremont Street in Oscars.</p>
<p><b>Walk down to Main Street Station Casino and Brewery.</b> We like Main Street Station because it has a wild west feel. Large Chandeliers line the ceiling, and the bar has its own Brewery!</p>	<p><b>A small beer?-</b> Too early for a taste of their own Brew? It's rare to find a great brewery and this is some lovely beer, worth a taste.</p>
<p><b>Wander back via the stairs by the door and over the walkway into California Hotel and Casino</b> - No amazing things to see here, but all human life is here as you make your way back to...</p>	<p><b>Lots or little to do.</b> In the quiet of day Fremont is a great place to wander, people watch, have a coffee or even ride the Zip line.</p>
<p><b>Meander Fremont Street.</b> Stay as long or short as you like then, with the Golden Nugget on your left, take a left, walk two blocks into concreteville, then take a right and you'll see a big square old court building which is the amazing...</p>	

<p><b>Mob Museum.</b> Award winning, this museum is the envy of many museums around the globe. As much an experience as you walk through its rooms, and as morally ambiguous as one would expect in Vegas. Take your time, which can easily be a few hours.</p>	<p><b>Exit Through The Gift Shop.</b> Often there are guest book-signers, and often they are ex mobsters or people linked to the mob world. If you know anyone who likes boos of this ilk its a great Birthday present mine!</p>
<p><b>Back to Freemont or Stop in at The Downtown Grand.</b> A very new hotel for Vegas, over the road from the Mob Museum, is a nice place to stop in and talk about what you've just done, rest the feet.</p>	
<p><b>An Afternoon Swim.</b> It's time to relax. You're feet will have worked hard enough.</p>	<p>If staying Downtown head back to the pool, or see if you can visit the Golden Nugget as a non guest - it is rumoured to be \$20 to do so, but can get very busy.</p>
<p><b>Dinner</b> - Two top Trusted options for your evening meal depending on where you are and what transport you have.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <i>Vic and Anthony's Steakhouse</i> - Inside the Golden Nugget this is not a cheap option (for Vegas) but is certainly good value considering it has been voted one of the best restaurants in the USA. The steak is delicious and the staff are superb.</li> <li>2. <i>The Peppermill Fireside Lounge</i> - It really isn't much to look at from the outside, but once inside its 70's, Neon, and has both an open fire and a set of trees growing indoors. The food is to die for.</li> </ol>	<p>A taxi, car, or bus is needed to reach the Peppermill. This is in a car park between he Riviera and The Wynn.</p> <p>Be aware, the Peppermill portions are HUGE. The food is phenomenal so pick wisely, but you don't need two courses!</p>
<p><b>The Stratosphere.</b> What a view for after-dinner drinks. This is another option for food if you want to sit in the revolving restaurant, but the above food choices are much better. The Stratosphere is best for the view. The highest point in Vegas.</p>	<p>You can throw yourself off the Stratosphere on The Skyjump (a vertical zip line, like a controlled bungee), ride the theme park rides on top, or just soak in the view. <b>Get there for sunset if you can.</b></p> <p>Top Tip: You may have to queue to go up to the observation deck where all of the above are. However, if you're happy to stay indoors and have a cocktail, ask for the lift to the bar 'LEVEL 107'. It's a sleek cocktail lounge, offering phenomenal views and comfy seats.</p>

	Again, be sure to ask for the correct life so you avoid paying and queuing.
<b>The Fremont Street Experience.</b> See the lights show, see the acts, get lost in the buzz and the noise, until you just can't take any more.	<b>Ok, so you're tired,</b> but you're in Vegas, and you can have a lie in tomorrow. The light show happens every fifteen minutes or so, and depending on your taste its either great fun, or a bit over-sold! But hey, the entire street goes dark and a show happens above your head. And its FREE. Come on, it's worth it.

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
